STREET TREE LIST
Revised June 2012

Per the Street Tree Ordinance, Part III Chapter 18 Article 1 of the Dixon City Code, or as amended -

A Street Tree is any tree within that area between public street right-of-way lines plus five feet beyond the right-of-way on each side thereof. This generally equates to five feet behind the sidewalk on private property.

This is a list of **recommended** tree species to be planted in the Street Tree Area.

Prohibitions - It is unlawful to plant in the Street Tree Area the following trees:

blackwood acacia, black walnut, eucalyptus, elm, european hackberry, palm, poplar, sweet gum, tree of heaven, sycamore, locust, fruiting mulberry.

It is also unlawful to plant willow, cottonwood or poplar trees **anywhere** in the City unless the City Engineer or Public Works Director approves the site as one where the roots will not interfere with a public sewer.
