

\$162K added to annual operating costs for new facility.



#### A DELAY IS EXPENSIVE!





Delays could disqualify Dixon for a special low-rate loan from the state and incur substantial fines.

Construction costs could increase 5% each year of delay.



Dixon's wastewater treatment facility (WWTF) is old and undergoing improvements. We will be fixing worn and outdated treatment processes in order to comply with the new operating permit issued by the State of California. You need to know how this project will affect you.






Existing WWTF wastes 25% of the City's water through evaporation.



WWTF is out of code for earthquake, fire & hazardous materials.

New WWTF will use the proven "Activated Sludge" process, which is low cost and effective.

- Lower concentration of salts going to groundwater.
- Lower concentrations of boron, chloride and nitrates.
- Less fresh water evaporation so more water percolates to groundwater.



Existing WWTF has failing & unsafe equipment and buildings.



Must comply with new permit by June 2017 or face fines and penalties up to \$10,000/day.
